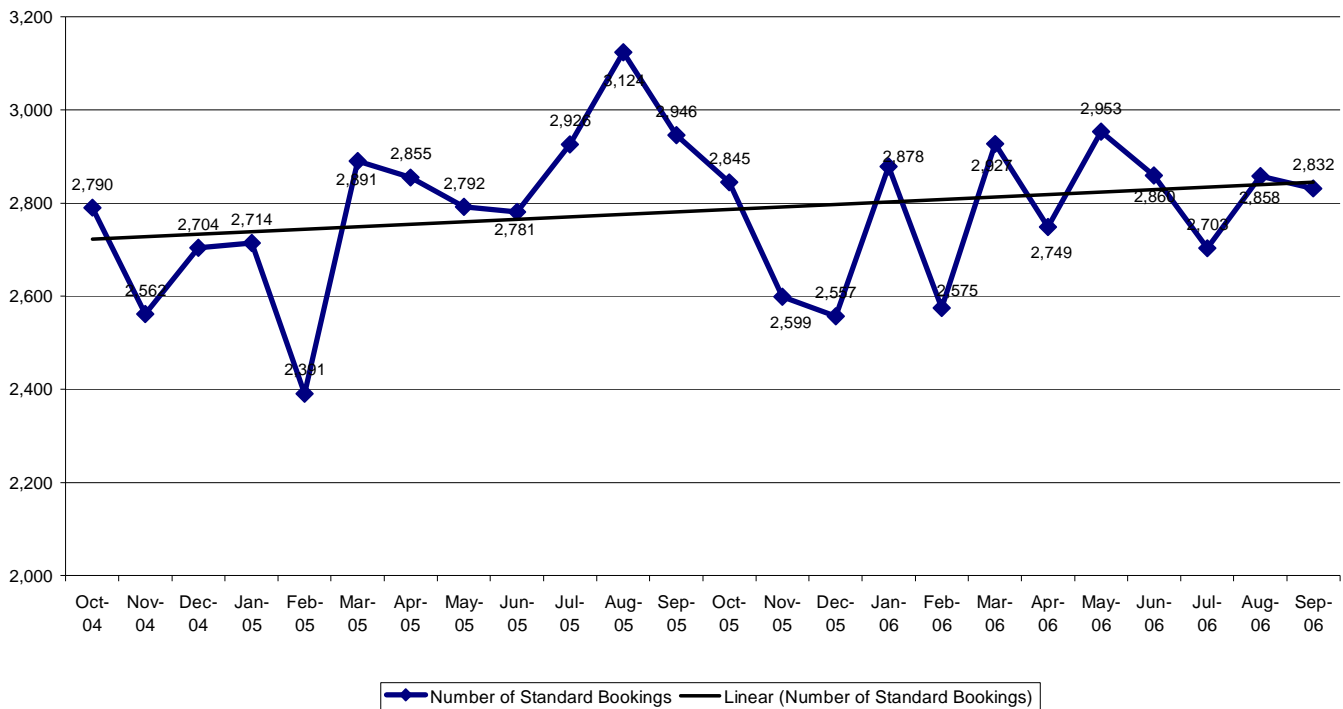

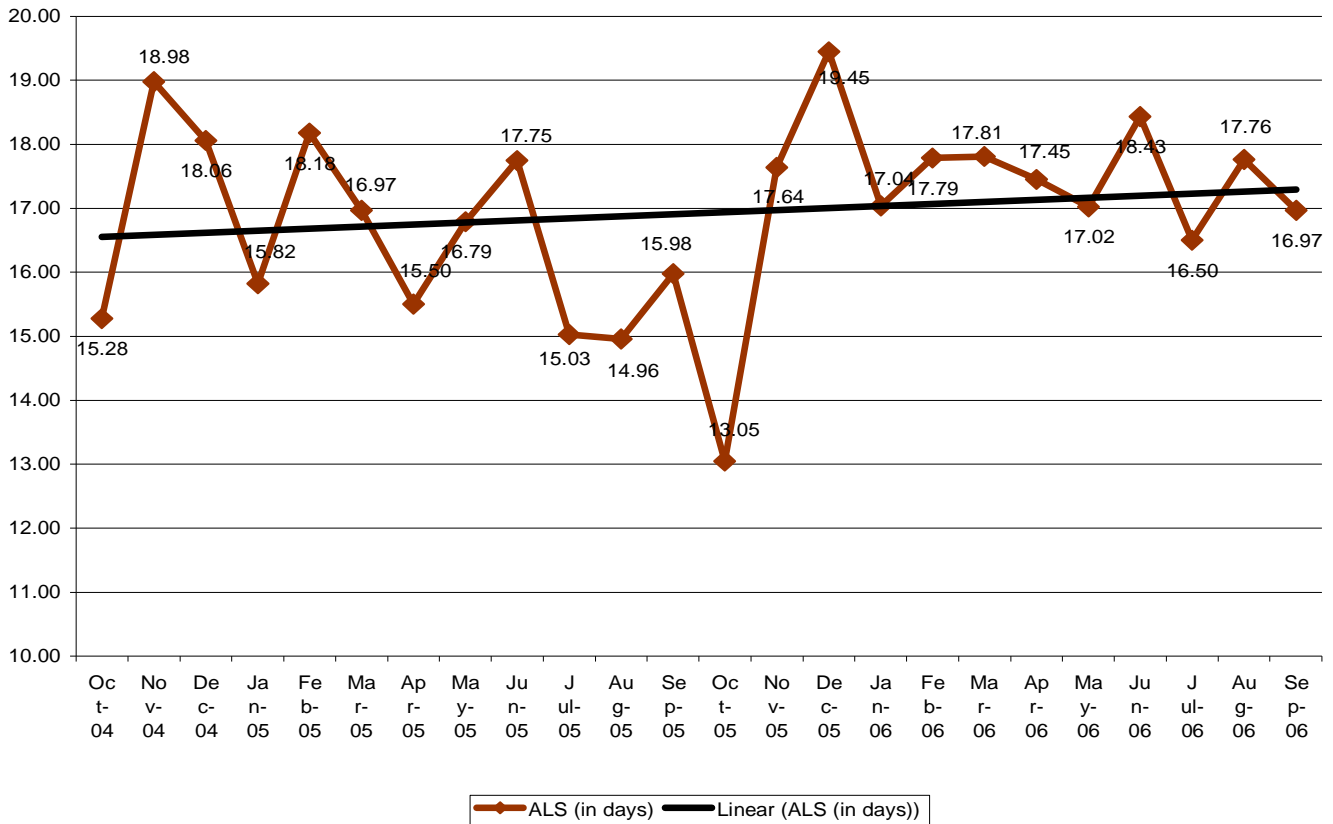
Multnomah County Monthly Jail Statistics September 2006

Standard Bookings for September slightly decreased by 26, totaling 2,832 for the month; less than a 1% drop from August and a 3.9% decline from September of 2005. The Average Length of Stay during September was 16.97 days; half a day less than August and a full day longer than this time last year. The Average Daily Population stayed virtually the same as August, ending at 1,670.65; 8.8% more than September 2005's average of 1,524.54. Turn Self In bookings also stayed the same as last month, 306, which is 30 bookings or 9.8% less than one year ago. Cite & IDs increased during September by 11.8% from August and was just slightly lower than September of 2005's total of 464. A total of 139 Emergency Population Releases occurred during September; a jump from August's low of 26 early releases, however still 70% lower than last September's total of 467 releases. The Average score of those released during September rose to 61, doubling the average for August and became the highest monthly average on record. There were 20 early releases in September of scores between 100 and 149 which drove the monthly average to double. Booking for the Portland Project 57 was at their highest, totaling 459 during September. A new chart has been added showing the percentage of Sentenced and Unsentenced in custody each month.

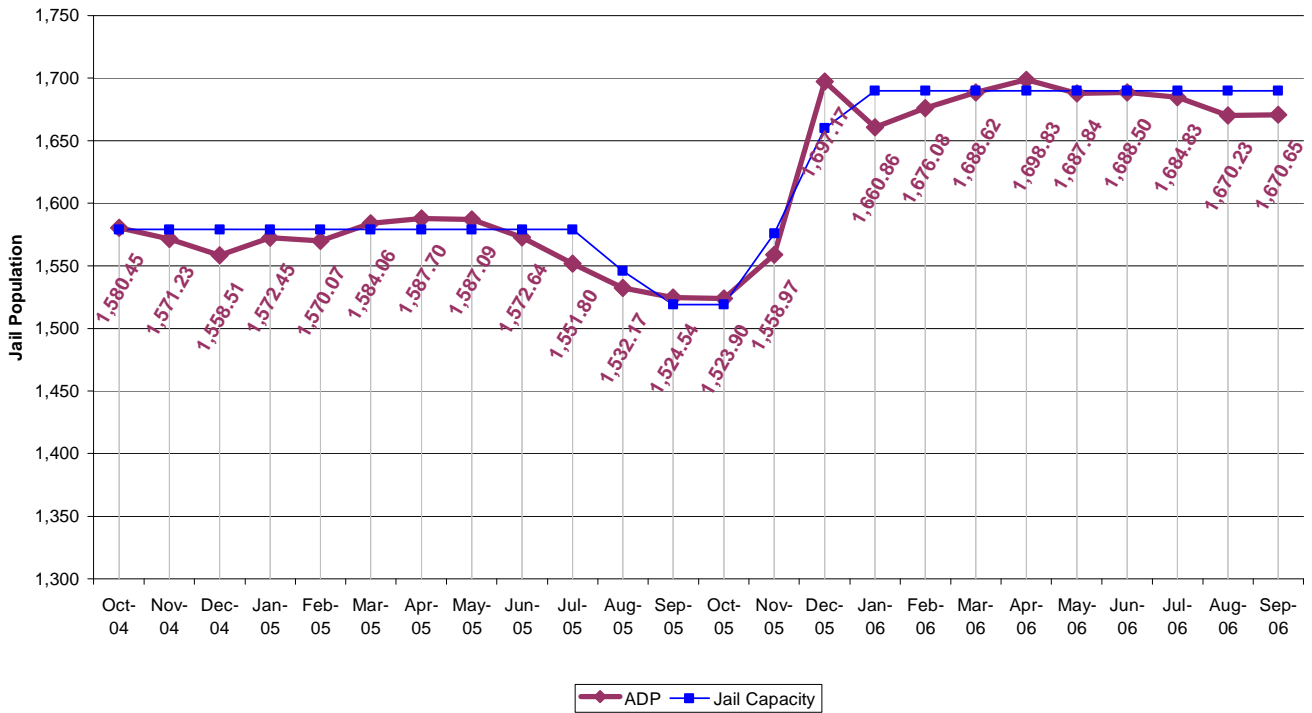
Standard Bookings



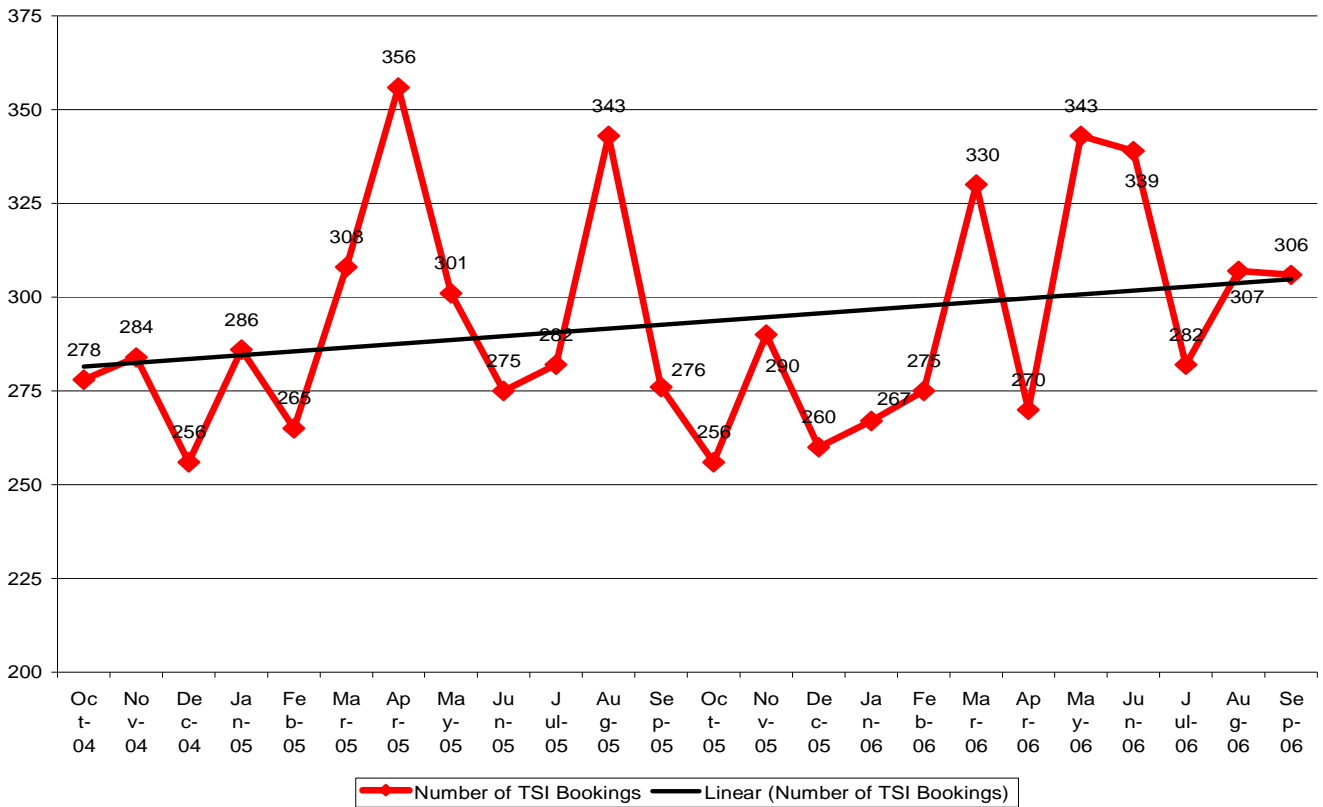
Average Length of Stay



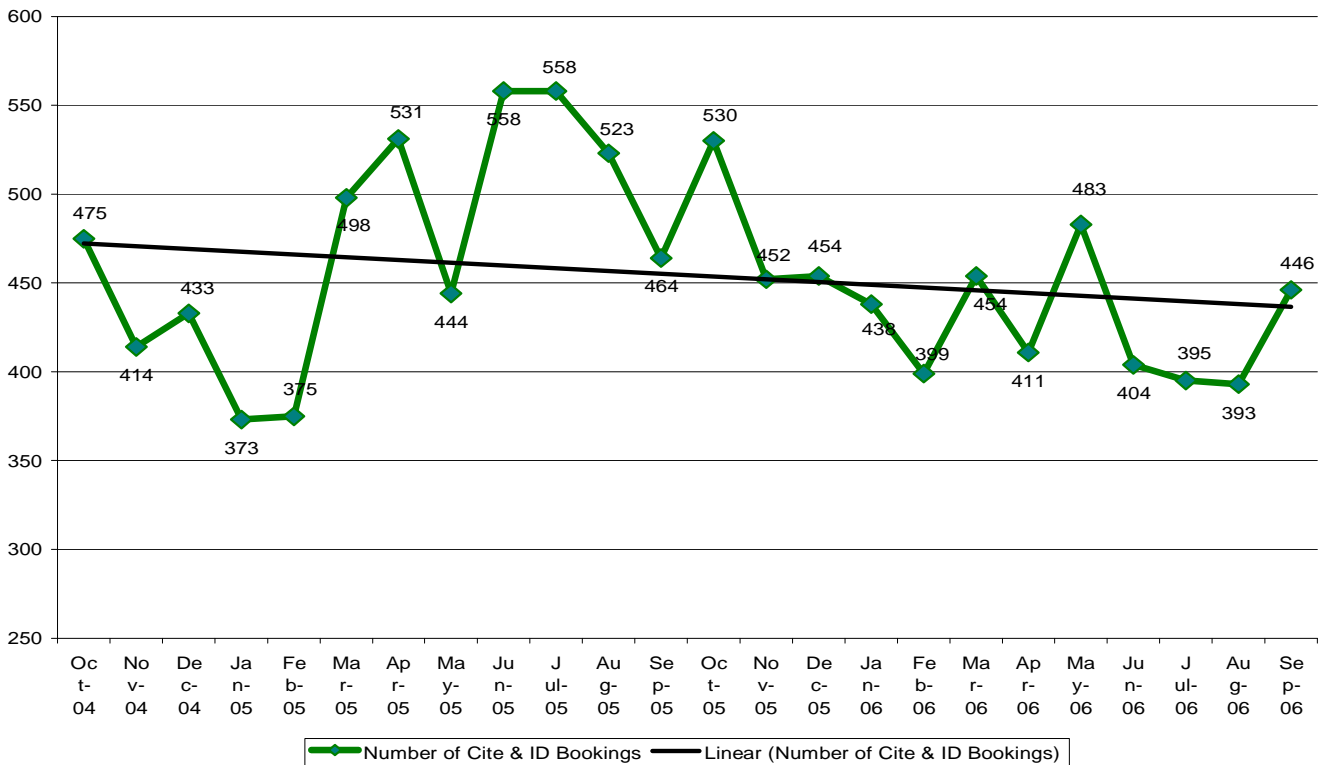
Average Daily Population



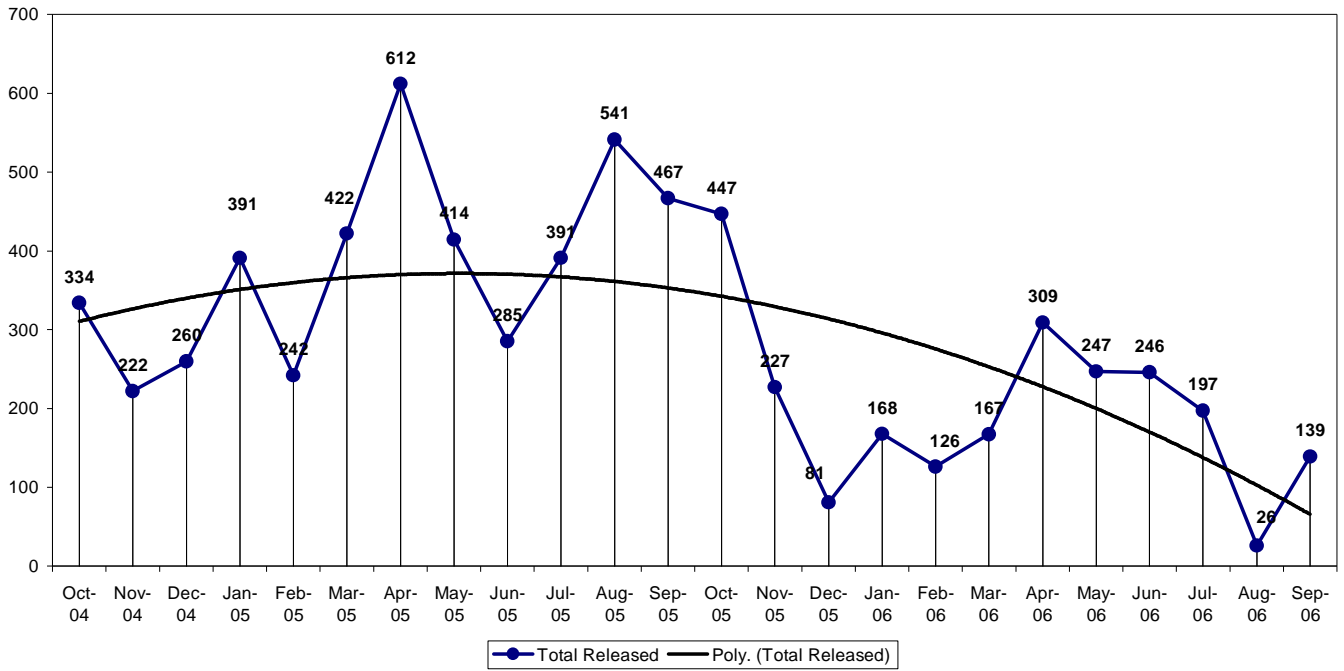
Turn-Self-In (TSI) Bookings



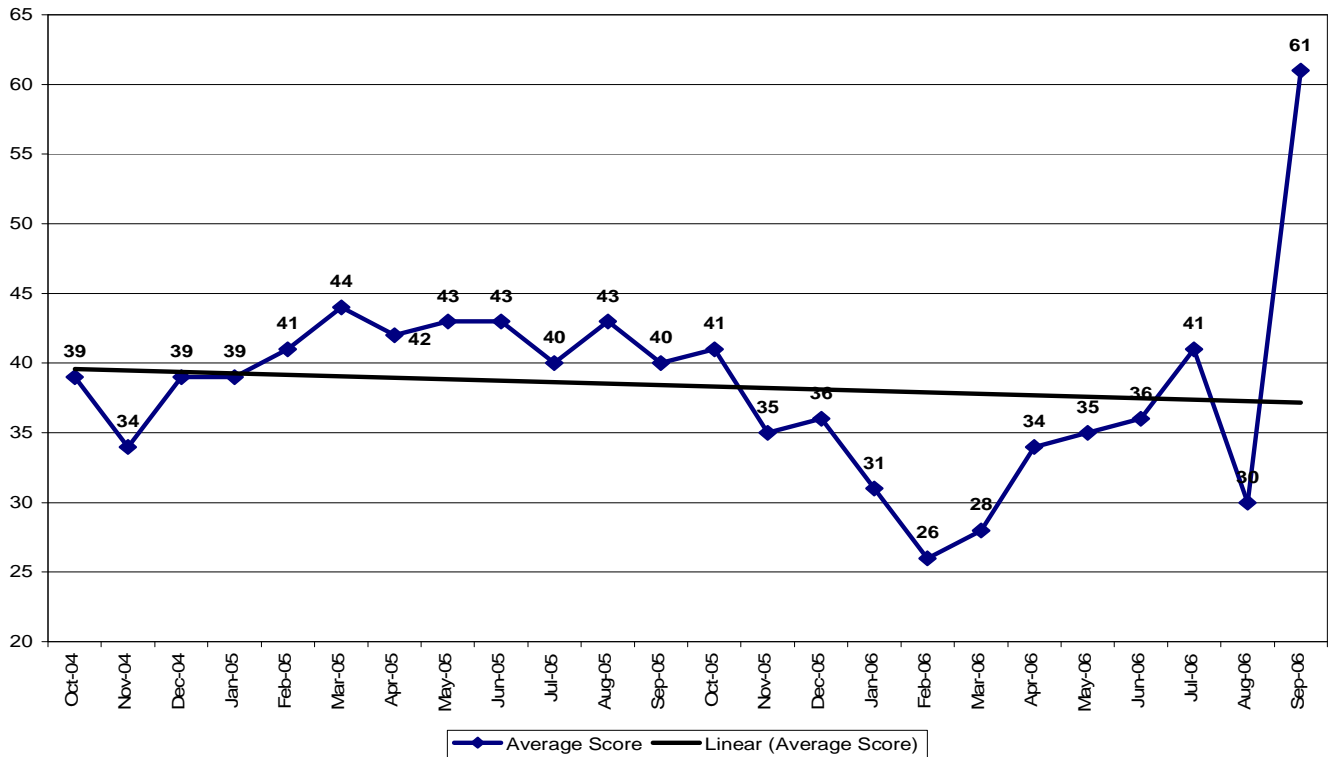

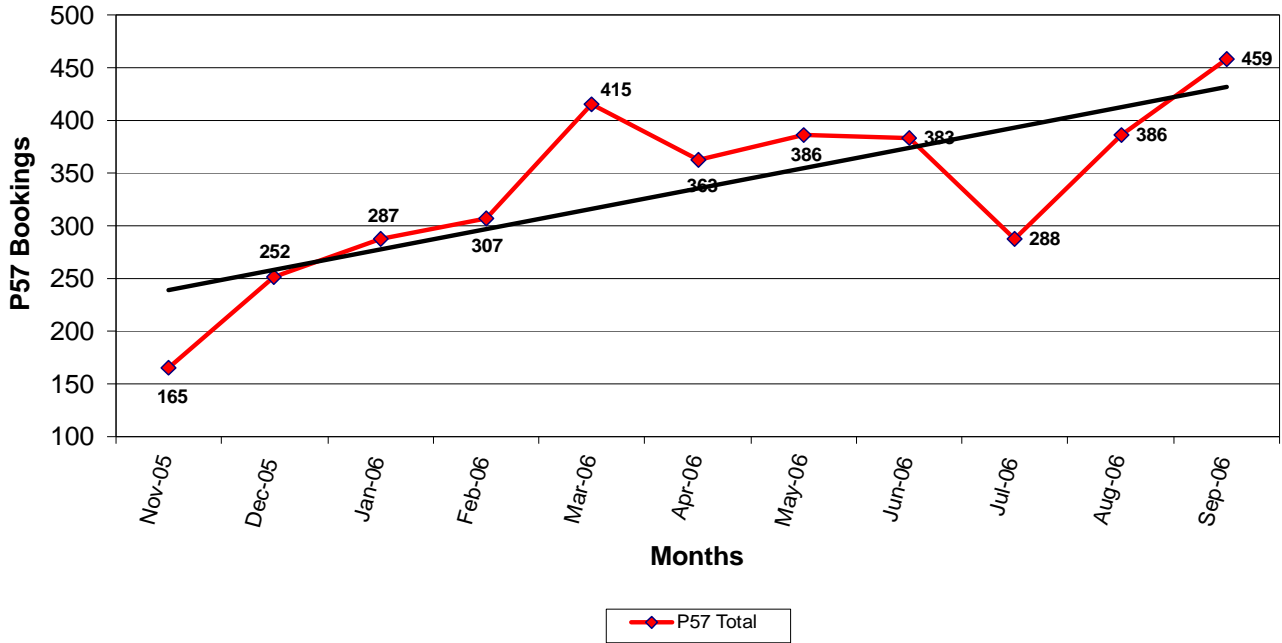
Emergency Population Releases by Month
