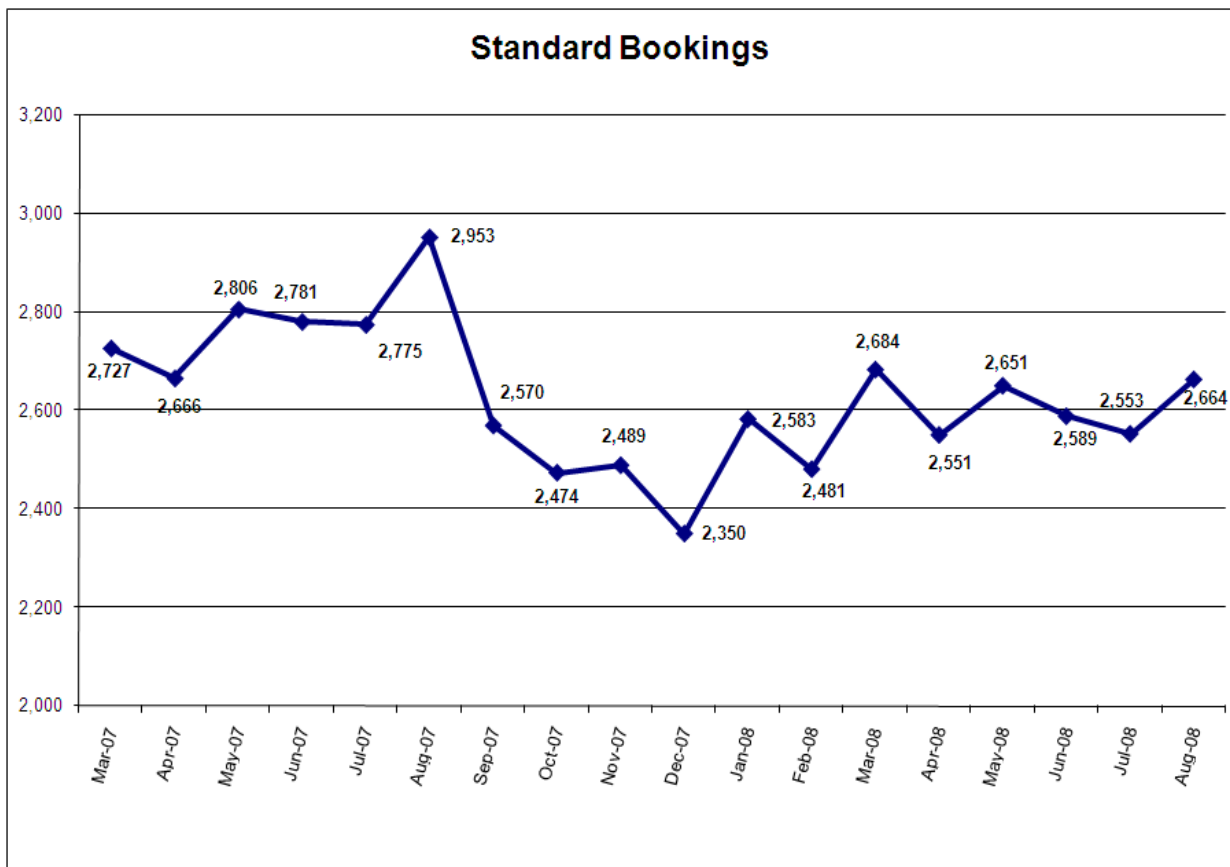

## Multnomah County Monthly Jail Statistics August 2008

Standard bookings rose by just over 100 from the previous month, totaling 2664 in August. TSI, Cite & ID, and Portland Project 57 bookings were also up slightly over July. However, average length of stay (ALS) continued to decline, dropping from 16.64 days in July to 16.17 days in August. †

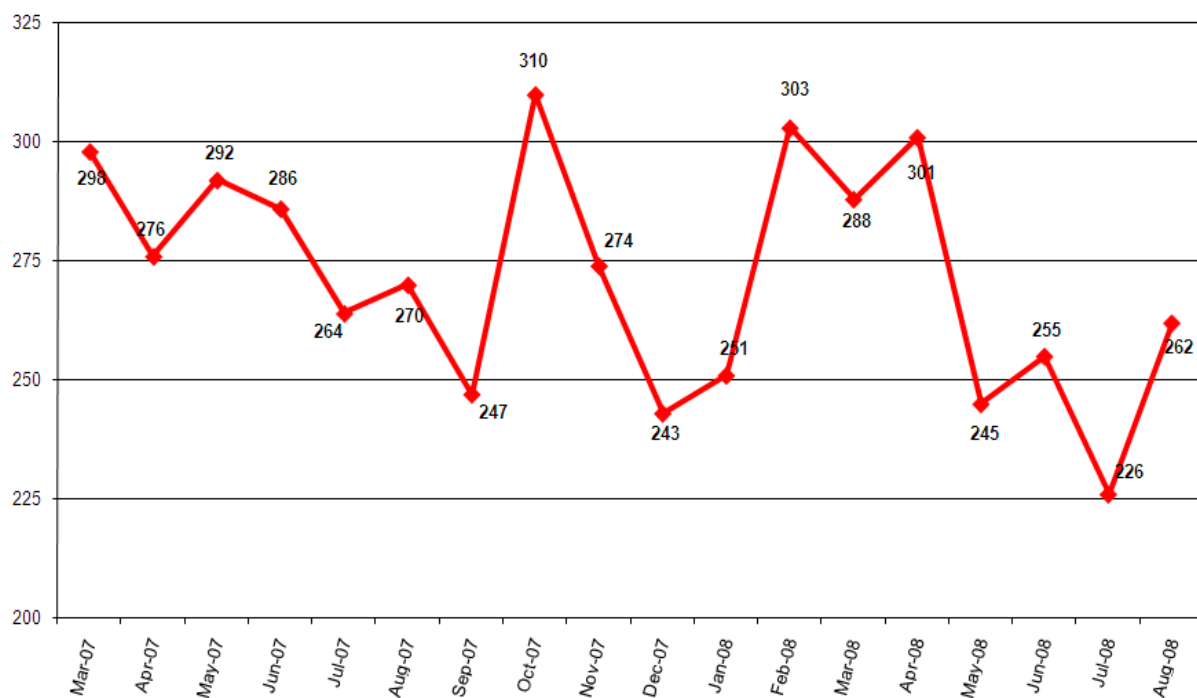
Average daily population (ADP) also saw another slight decline, from 1418 inmates per day in July to 1389 in August. There were no emergency population releases (EPRs) in August, and the jail population did not go into emergency release status on any day during the month. The number of post-sentence offenders released between 12 AM and 8 AM, the time of day during which access to public transportation and social services is most limited, has remained under 50 for the past six months.

The number of inmates jailed post trial and for holds remained relatively stable from August 1 to September 1, while the count of those jailed pre-trial declined slightly from the previous month. The count of inmates held pre-trial more than 150 days totaled 102 on September 1, twelve more than on August 1. Inmates held pre-trial on murder-related charges remained at 57 on September 1, with the number held between one and two years totaling 12, and those held two years or more dropping to just four.

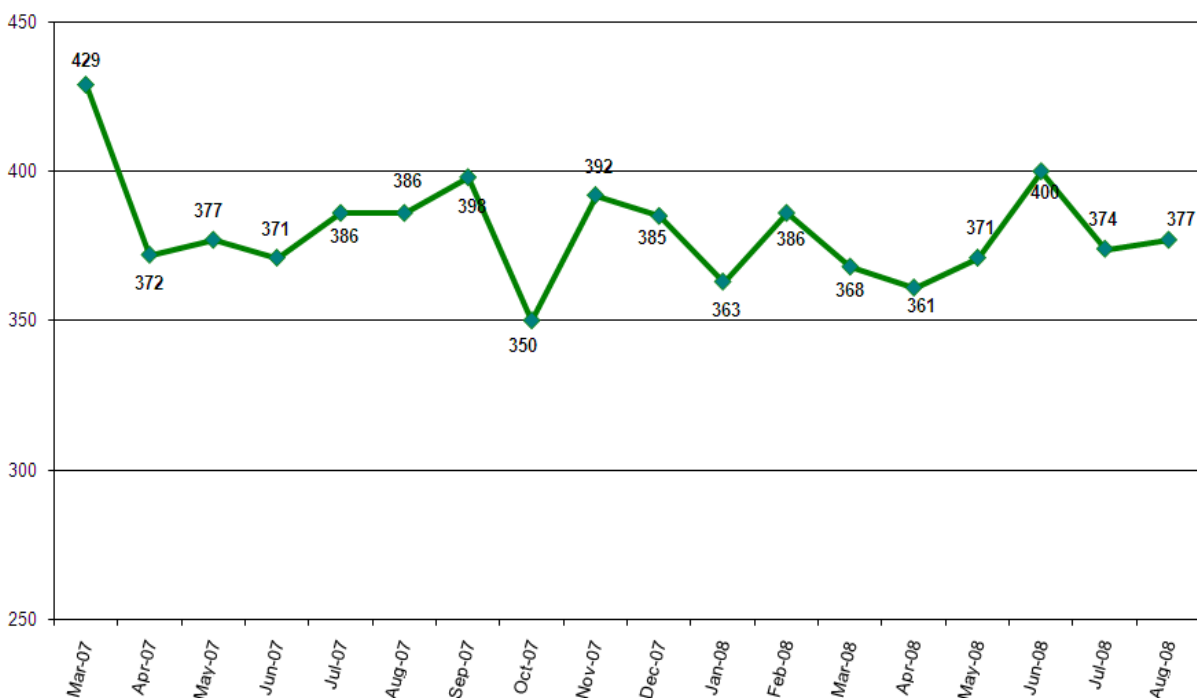

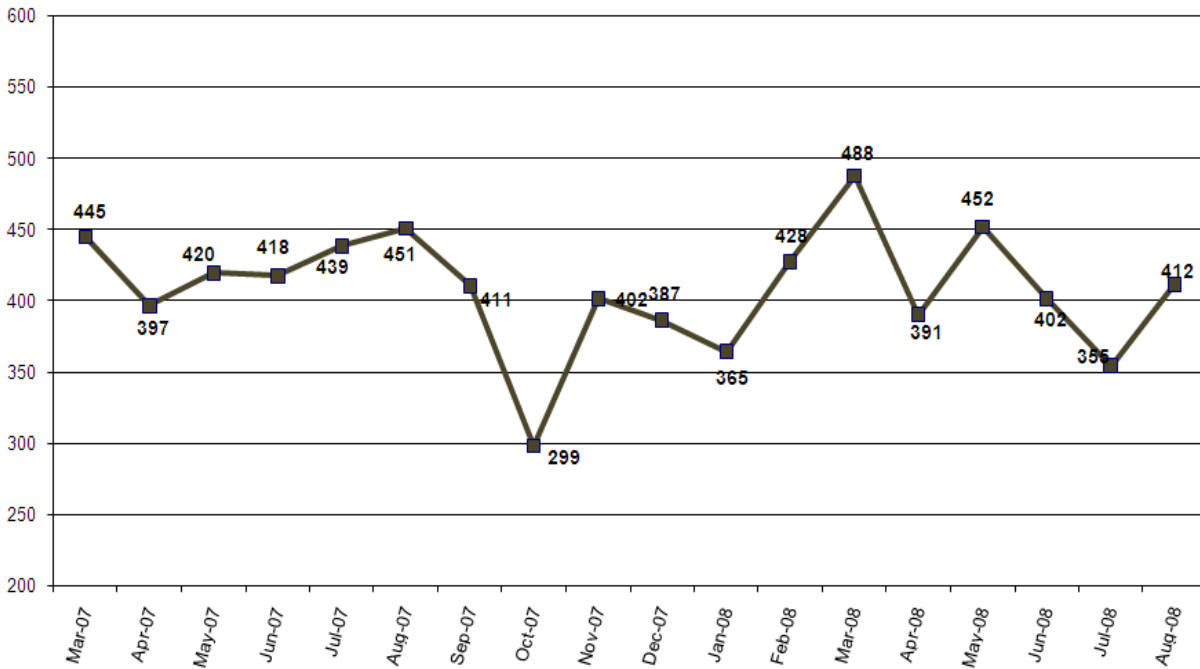
### Turn-Self-In (TSI) Bookings



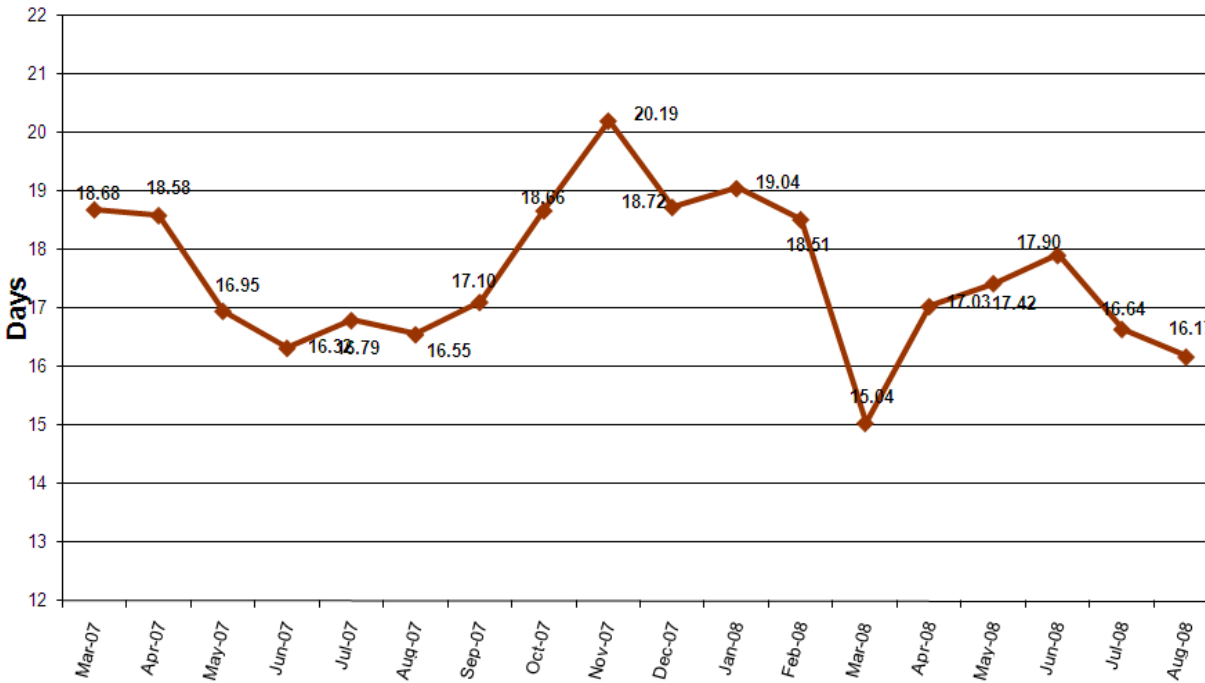

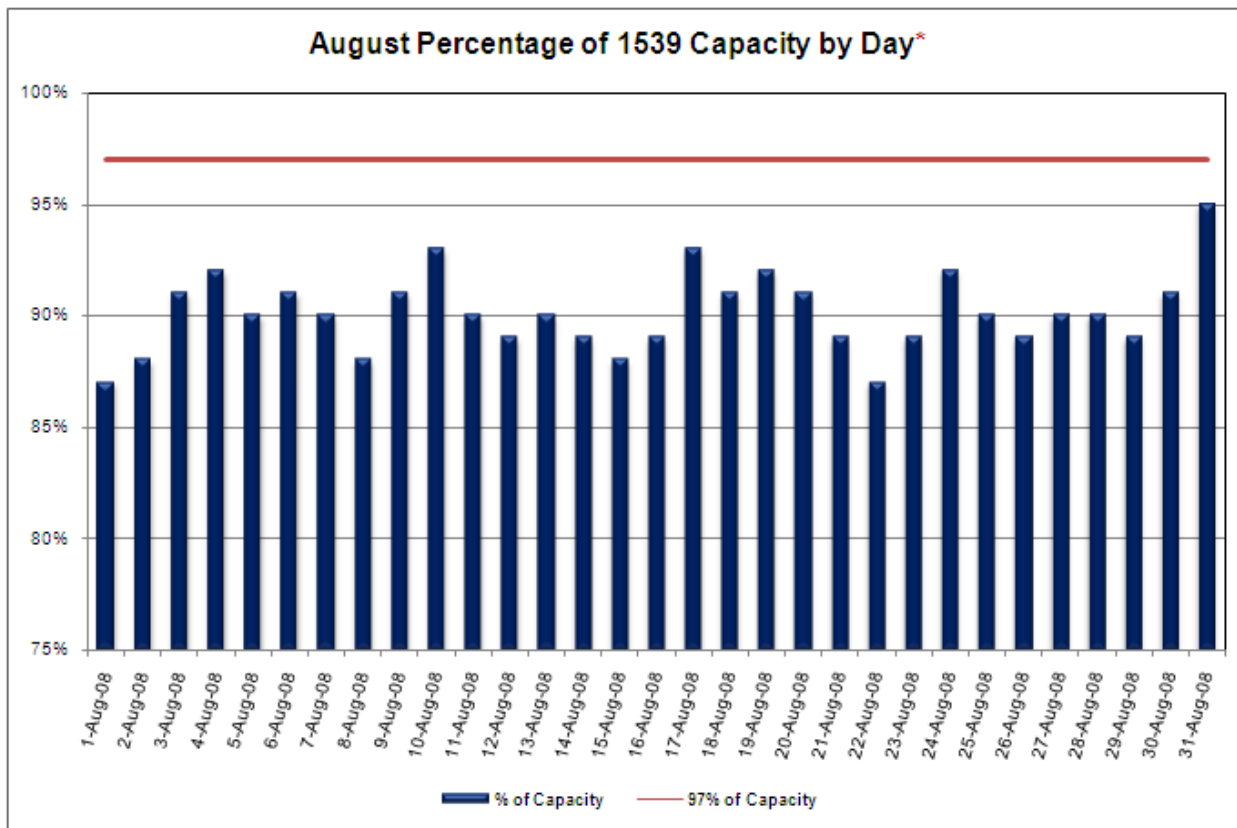
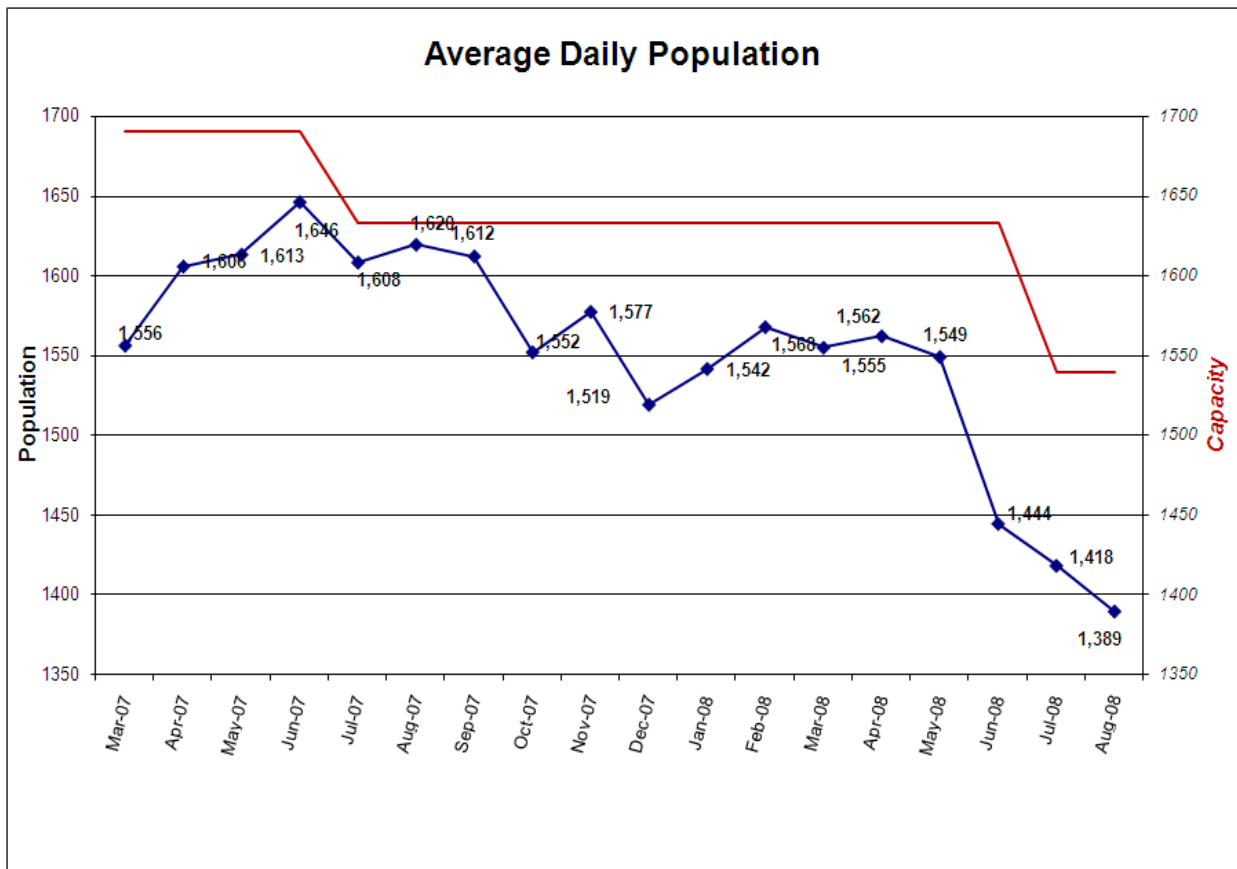


**Portland 57 Project - Total Bookings by Month**



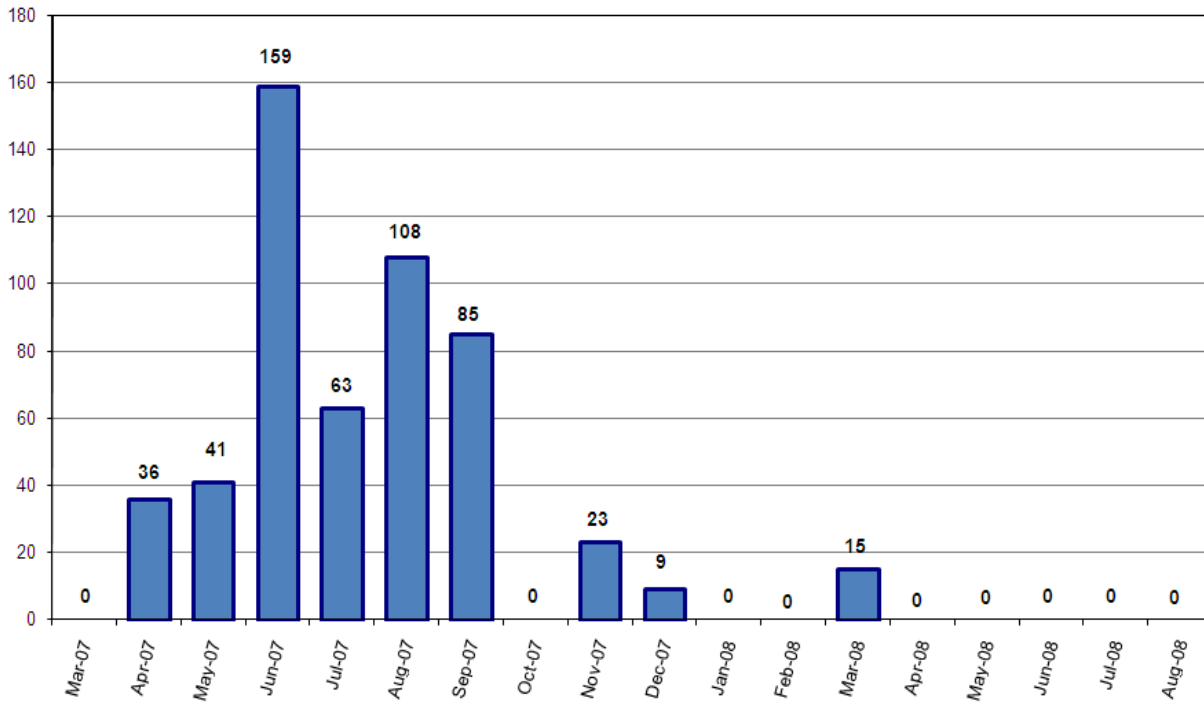
**Average Length of Stay (in days)**



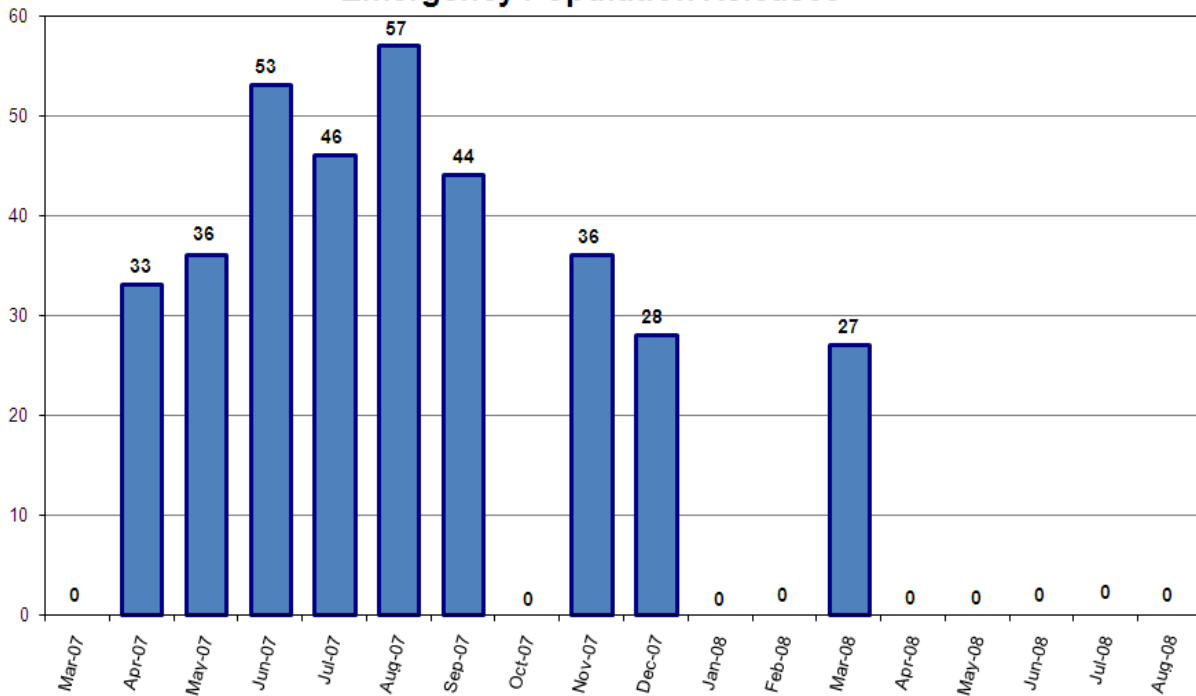


\*Red bars indicate days on which EPRs occurred, if any. Note that EPRs do not always or only occur when capacity exceeds the 97% threshold. Efforts are made to balance the population to the demands of the classification system for specific types of jail beds and balance the space needs for male or female inmates. Additionally, jail capacity varies throughout the day, with these capacity calculations based on 10PM population counts.

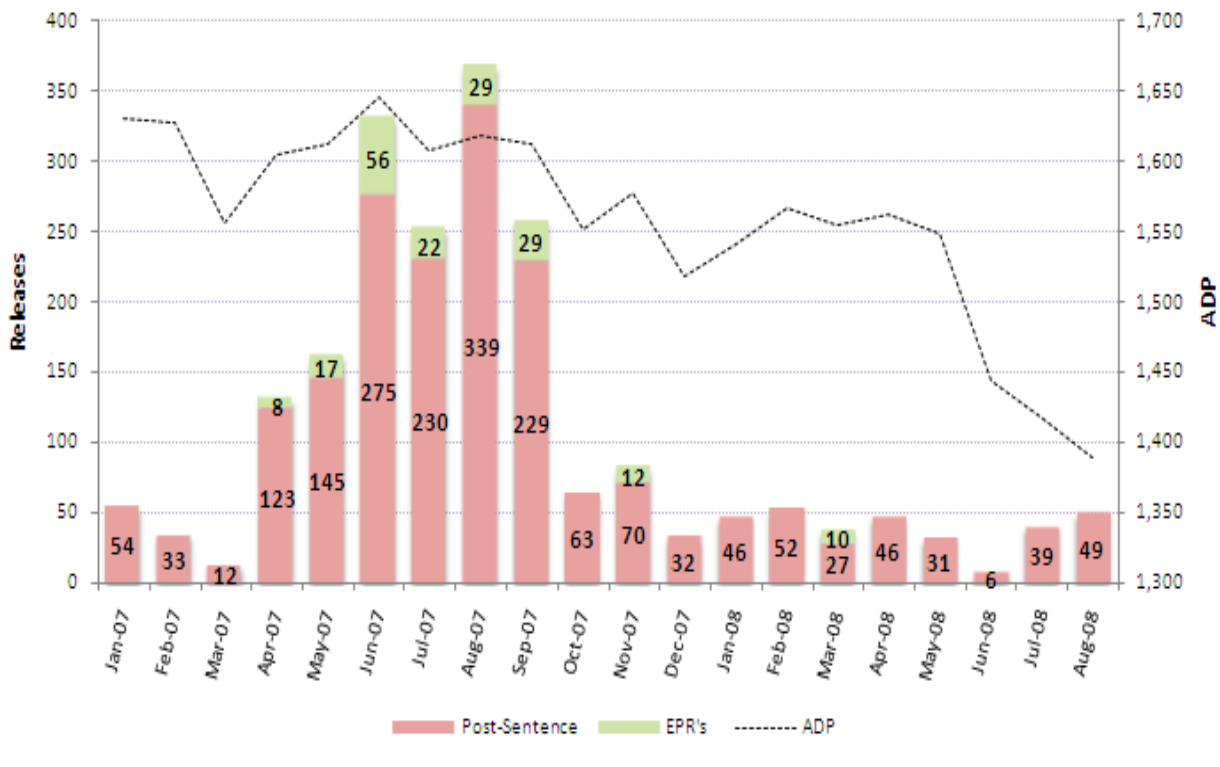
### Emergency Population Releases by Month



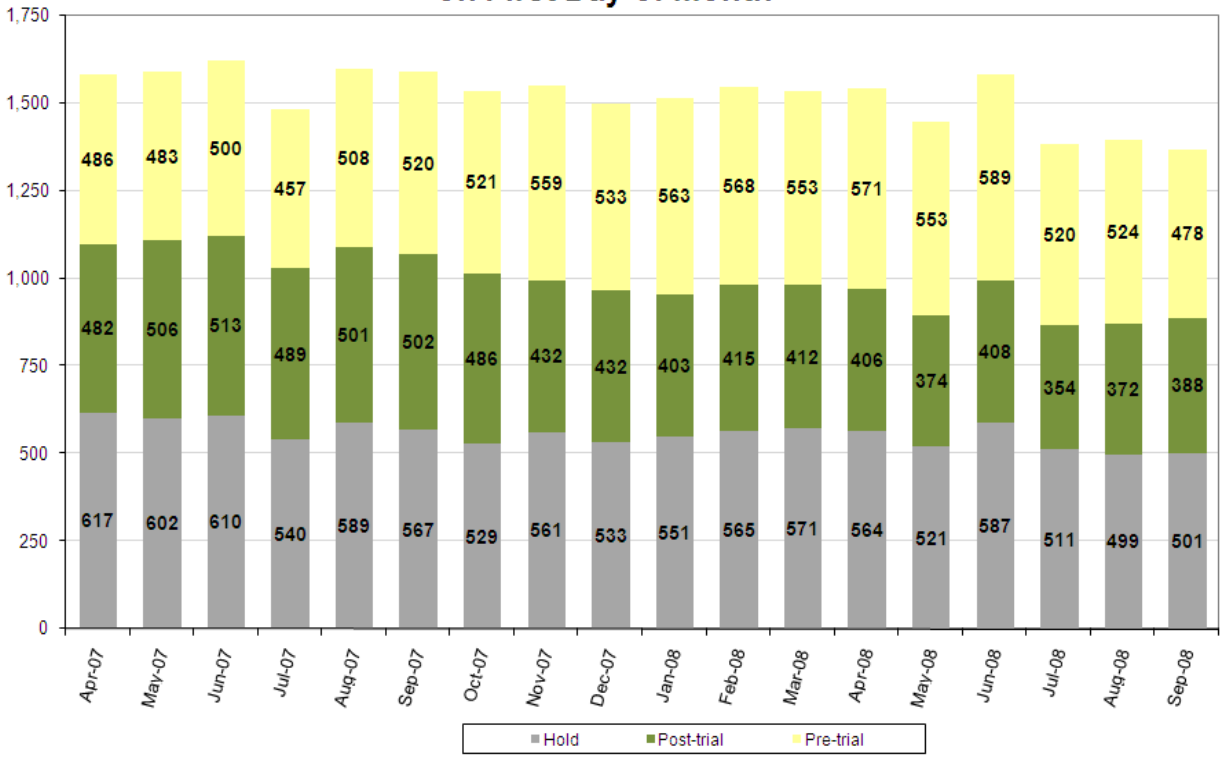
### Monthly Average Score of Emergency Population Releases



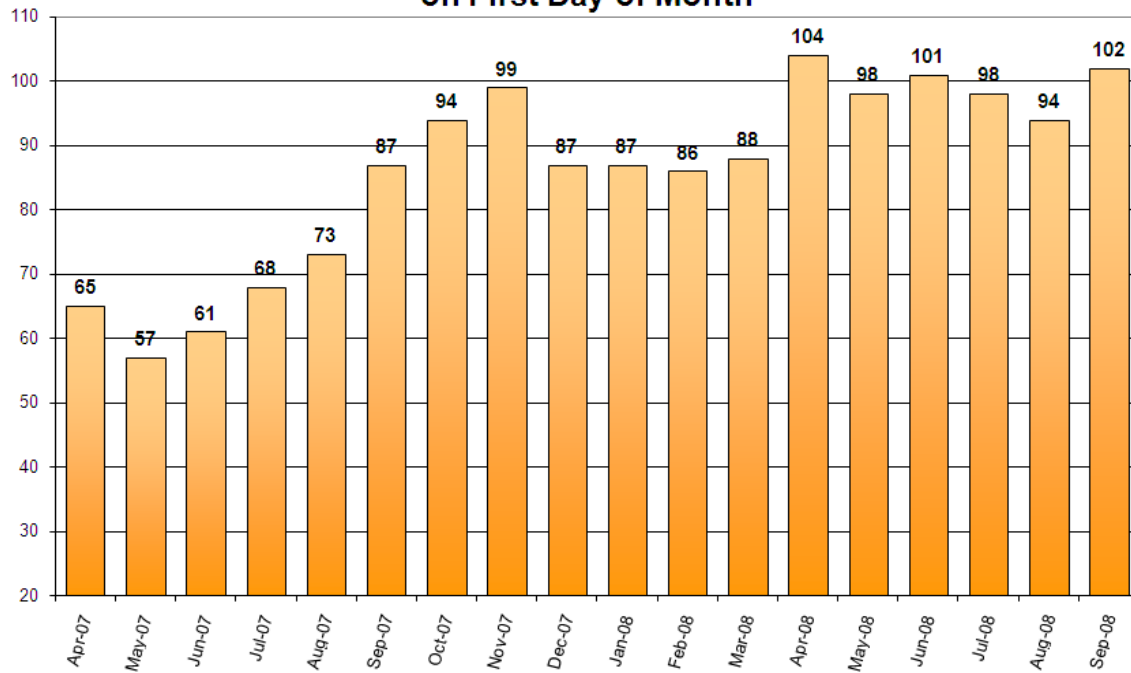
### Post-Sentence and EPR Releases between 12 AM and 8 AM



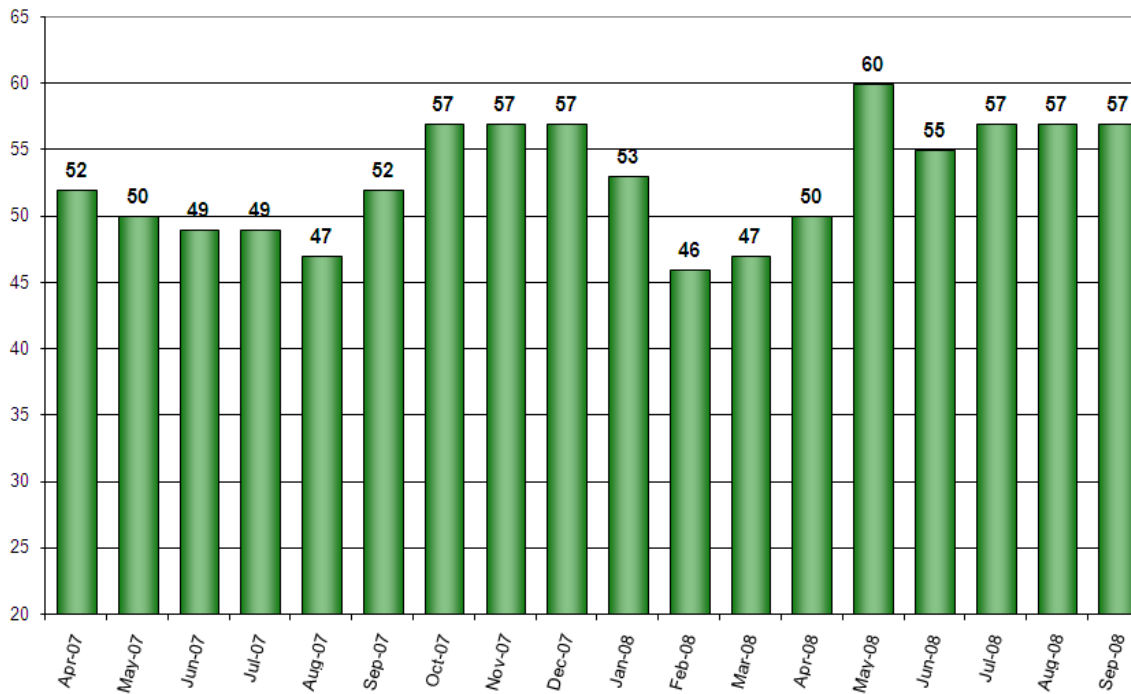
### Pre-Trial vs. Post-Trial vs. Holds in Custody on First Day of Month
